## C-27J Spartan And C-130J Hercules Together For The First Time

The Lockheed Martin C-130J Hercules airlifter and the new C-27J Spartan tactical transport were brought together for the first time at Farnborough 2000, the biennial international air show now going on outside London.

The C-27J crew's flight demonstration opened the show this past Sunday with a short-field takeoff, high and low speed low altitude passes in front of the crowd, turns with various flap configurations, and a short-field landing.

The C-27J, manufactured jointly by Alenia Aerospazio and Lockheed Martin Aeronautics Company, is based on the proven G.222 design and features the propulsion system and avionics developed for its "big brother," the C-130J. The C-130J, now in service with the Royal Air Force, Royal Australian Air Force, U.S. Air National Guard, and Air Force Reserve Command, was also put through its paces with a flight demonstration that included a max effort takeoff.

Several thousand government officials, industry executives, and worldwide media representatives are in attendance at the air show, which continues through July 30.
