Sweeping Changes In Defense Reform Expected To Come From Upcoming AIAA Conference

Decision makers from the top levels of the Executive and Legislative branches, the Pentagon, industry and Wall Street will meet in Washington, D.C., Feb. 14-15 at the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA) Defense Reform 2001 Conference and Exhibition to recommend sweeping changes to the new Administration regarding defense reform initiatives.

- Build a decisive political constituency favoring far-reaching changes
- * Produce an actionable plan to bring those changes about

Sponsored by the AIAA and defense contractors, the conference will feature a wide variety of speaking panels led by decision makers from all aspects of the defense and financial industries.

Topics for discussion at the two-day event will include: Assessing the Health and Viability of the U.S. Defense Industry; The Future of Acquisition Reform; Setting the New Defense Priorities and Reinvigorating the Acquisition Reform Agenda; DoD and the Defense Industry Partnership; Financial Health of the Defense Industry in 2001; Military Requirements for Defense and the Budget Allocation for Defense Procurement; The Global Marketplace, and Defense Reform Recommendations.
