The Aegis Weapon System is currently installed on 65 U.S. Navy cruisers and destroyers on station around the globe, and at least 24 more ships are planned. Aegis is the primary naval weapon system for Japan and is part of two European ship construction programs - the Spanish F-100 and the Norwegian New Frigate.
