

Lockheed Martin CROSSBOW II Team Wins \$25 Million Follow-On Prime Contract

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The U.S. Air Force has awarded Lockheed Martin a \$25 million follow-on prime contract for the CROSSBOW II program. Commencing on January 1, 2005, this four-year, nine-month program will provide classified maintenance and engineering support at various Air Force sites.

"The CROSSBOW II win is an excellent example of outstanding team performance," said Ken Asbury, president of Lockheed Martin Technical Operations. "The scope of the proposal was significant, the preparation timeline was compressed, and we were up against tough competition.
