Other activities include a Science through Food activity, an Orange County sheriff helicopter fly-in and stunt demonstration, a Passport in Time Journey Walk through 50 years of the Space industry's history, and an opportunity for children to learn about the role rockets and satellites play in our daily lives. Children will also be writing postcards to troops abroad throughout the day.
