

# Lockheed Martin Reaches Out Online To Collaborate With Small Technology Businesses Through DeEXCHANGE

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In an effort to expand its collaboration with small, high-tech businesses, Lockheed Martin announced it has engaged the DeEXCHANGE, an online service that matches small, technology firms with business opportunities.

DeEXCHANGE is an initiative managed by DX-CEEDS, Inc., a non-profit economic development organization, with the support of the U.S. Department of Commerce's Technology Opportunities Program. DX-CEEDS's mission is to develop enriching relationships between mainstream and underserved communities through entrepreneurship and technology-based economic development initiatives.

Among its services, the DeEXCHANGE enables small businesses to review Small Business Innovative Research (SBIR) contract opportunities with the federal government. Now, when a business selects certain SBIRs, an automated message from Lockheed Martin will invite that business to contact company representatives involved in the development of related technologies or programs directly to discuss potential collaboration opportunities.
