

# Lockheed Martin Names Ronald T. Rand Senior Vice President, Communications

Lockheed Martin today named Ronald T. Rand as the Corporation's Senior Vice President, Communications. Rand succeeds Dennis R. Boxx who retired earlier this month.

Rand currently serves as Pratt & Whitney's Vice President, Communications, where he leads the company's worldwide internal and external communications, including public relations; employee communications; advertising and branding; public affairs; and communications in support of sales and marketing. Rand will join Lockheed Martin May 1.

"Ron Rand brings a wealth of talent and experience to Lockheed Martin, and we are pleased to have him on our team," said Lockheed Martin Chairman, President and CEO Bob Stevens.

Rand is a retired U.S. Air Force Brigadier General. Rand has a master's degree in mass communication from Boston University and a bachelor's degree from the U.S. Air Force Academy.
