GEM elettronica President Giuseppe Merlini said, "We are extremely honored that Lockheed Martin is looking at GEM elettronica as a licensed manufacturer for their state-of-the-art multi-functional naval consoles."

GEM elettronica will display the NGW at the Euronaval International Naval Defence and Maritime Exposition and Conference, on October 27-31, in Paris, France.
