His experience includes Enterra Solutions, mCapitol Management, ICF Kaiser International, Westinghouse Electric Corporation, The American Nuclear Energy Council and staff work within the House of Representatives. Billings has a Bachelor's of Arts in Political Science from the University of Puget Sound and has participated in the Executive Development Program at the Wharton School of Business, University of Pennsylvania.
