Haiti is one of the poorest countries in the world, with 80 percent of the population living in abject poverty. FINCA Haiti has been providing much-needed financial services since 1989. Before the January 12th earthquake, the program provided financial services to almost 12,000 people -- 94% of them women -- who spend less than \$1 a day per household member. Access to small loans can greatly improve the quality of life for poor Haitian families by improving nutrition, allowing access to healthcare, and providing school fees so children can attend school and, hopefully, break the vicious cycle of poverty.
