Panels and tutorials are offered for unclassified and classified audiences. To date, over 800 papers have been received for presentation at this year's conference.

This premier event will open on Sunday, October 31 at 5 p.m. with the grand opening of the exhibit hall. The exhibit hall space is sold out, but there is space available in the table top area and outdoors, which is an excellent location to feature a company's large equipment and demonstrations.

There are other special events and tours available for families including golf and tours to Monterey/Carmel and San Francisco. The showcase event is Monday night at The Tech Museum of Innovation, San Jose's popular hands-on science and exploration museum.
