Lockheed Martin recently submitted two 45-hour courses to AMU for evaluation: Critical Thinking and Asymmetric Threat Operations. Any attendee taking either of the courses can receive three credit hours for each towards an undergraduate degree from AMU, with the credits for Asymmetric Threat Operations applicable to major course requirements for the BA in Intelligence Studies, BA in Security Management and BA in Homeland Security.

Lockheed Martin's Center for Security Analysis offers intelligence analysis training to the Department of Defense, law enforcement community and U.S. citizens employed by federal or state governments, and U.S. corporations or organizations engaged in intelligence and security. The courses were opened to a wider audience in 2008 to meet the growing demand for individually-focused expert training on analysis and data mining tools.
