

Lockheed Martin Names Bernard "Barry" McCullough Vice President Of Business Strategy For Mission Systems & Sensors

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15, 2011 /PRNewswire/ -- Lockheed Martin [NYSE: LMT] has appointed Bernard "Barry" McCullough vice president of Business Strategy for its Mission Systems & Sensors (MS2) business. MS2, based in Washington, D.C., is part of the Electronic Systems business area and has 14,000 employees, primarily based in the U.S., Canada and Australia.

"Barry brings to Lockheed Martin demonstrated excellence in large program execution across multiple complex domains, as well as creating and executing strategic plans," said Dale Bennett, president of Lockheed Martin's MS2 business. He served in many positions of increasing responsibility during his service including Deputy Chief of Naval Operations for Integration of Capabilities and Resources and Director of Surface Warfare. He also had numerous commands at sea including an Aegis cruiser and two carrier strike groups.

McCullough graduated from the U. S. Naval Academy in 1975 with a bachelor's degree in Naval Architecture.
