

Crittenton Services Bestows Legacy Award To Lockheed Martin's Linda Gooden

Executive Vice President honored for contributions to women and girls

Gooden is also an executive sponsor of Lockheed Martin Women's Leadership Forum.

"Linda Gooden is an incredible role model for the girls Crittenton serves. The girls are excited to learn about Linda and Lockheed Martin," said Pamela Jones, president and CEO, Crittenton Services. "Her commitment to young people is an inspiration to us all, and we appreciate her taking time to be with our girls and share her story."

CNN's Soledad O'Brien, co-founder of the Soledad O'Brien and Brad Raymond Foundation and Marlen Esparza, National Boxing Champion and 2012 Olympic-bound athlete, will join Gooden as this year's honorees. The High Tea will be attended by business, political, education and community leaders, all of whom will have the opportunity to interact with girls from Crittenton's Leadership Academy.

"Seeing firsthand the results of personal goal setting and high expectations for self is important for our girls," said Jones. "We look forward to an amazing program and being in the presence of some of the country's most powerful women."
