Now in their sixth year with Tour de Cure, the Lockheed Martin Colorado team raised more than \$51,000 towards the American Diabetes Association's mission. Riders represented many Front Range Lockheed Martin campuses including Boulder, Deer Creek, Waterton Canyon, South Park and Colorado Springs.
