In addition to ELGTR, Lockheed Martin's 350,000-square-foot production facility in northeasternPennsylvania designs and manufactures combat-proven Paveway II *Plus* LGB kits. The company has delivered training rounds, more than 70,000 LGB kits and 7,000 Dual Mode LGB kits to the U.S. Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force and 20 international customers.
