State Of South Carolina Declares Jan. 30 F-16 Fighting Falcon Day

COLUMBIA, S.C., Jan. 30, 2024 – Today South Carolina Gov. Henry McMaster read a formal proclamation from the South Carolina House of Representatives and Senate declaring Jan. 30 as F-16 Fighting Falcon Day.

The proclamation was created in honor of the 50th anniversary of the F-16 this year. The jet, which has flown out of South Carolina Air Force bases for decades, is now built in Greenville – and holds the distinction of being the reigning <u>Coolest Thing Manufactured in South Carolina</u>.

"The F-16 production line in Greenville is truly a national security asset, providing 21st Century Security capabilities to allies around the world who rely on this platform for peacekeeping and defense missions within their own borders and those of their partners," said Trish Pagan, vice president, F-16 Program and Greenville Site Lead, Lockheed Martin. "The deep roots and partnerships we have in South Carolina have made it possible for Lockheed Martin to successfully produce and deliver F-16s to these allies. We are proud and honored to be part of the fabric of this state."

Gov. McMaster added: "South Carolina is proud to be the Global Home of the F-16. Our rich military tradition, superb business-friendly environment, and world-class workforce are why manufacturers like Lockheed Martin have firmly established their roots in the Palmetto State. Lockheed Martin has long been a tremendous partner for South Carolina, contributing significantly to our prosperity. We look forward to building upon our already strong relationship in the years to come."

Lockheed Martin has made significant investments to cultivate the Greenville workforce. Within the past few years, the company has offered retention and incentive packages to bolster staffing, and invested substantial time and resources into on-the-job training and apprenticeships to establish a strong aviation manufacturing base in South Carolina. Greenville currently has approximately 1,700 employees, contributing to a total of about 2,200 employees across South Carolina.

To date, Lockheed Martin has delivered six F-16 Block 70 jets from the Greenville production facility to international partners Bahrain and Slovakia. There are currently 134 F-16s for six countries in the production backlog, and Bulgaria has signed a Letter of Offer and Acceptance for an additional eight jets for its fleet.
