My 32 years in the Army and State Department, as well as 18 years as National Security Director at Syracuse University and as CEO of Clear Path for Veterans, allowed me to give back for all that life has given me. Beyond his military career, Smullen has remained a respected leader, author and mentor in Central New York. He has written extensively on leadership and mentoring and continues to inspire others through his dedication to civic engagement, education and public service.
