

Lockheed Martin Announces \$1.1 Million Commitment To Penn State University

The announcement came as Lockheed Martin representatives met with Penn State President Graham B. Spanier and as the university approached the end of its seven-year Grand Destiny Campaign. The campaign, which will end June 30, has focused on increasing endowments and private support for the university.

"This is an investment not only in Penn State, its students, faculty and staff, but also in Lockheed Martin's future," said Stan Sloane, Lockheed Martin Corporate Liaison to Penn State and president of Lockheed Martin Management & Data Systems, headquartered in King of Prussia, Pa. "Each year, we strengthen our relationship with the university and we continue to benefit from the outstanding professionals that it produces."

For more than 25 years, Lockheed Martin has recognized Penn State as one of the nation's premier educational institutions.
